- For rural communities impacted by fire initiating from or spreading to BLM public land in NM
- **\$260,000** available, provided by National Fire Plan through Dept. of Interior/BLM

Three Funding Categories:

- Outreach and education projects reducing wildfire risk on private lands (up to \$15 K/project)
- CWPP updates for 5+ years (up to \$10K/project)
- Hazardous fuel reduction projects focusing on treatment to private lands (up to \$50K/project)

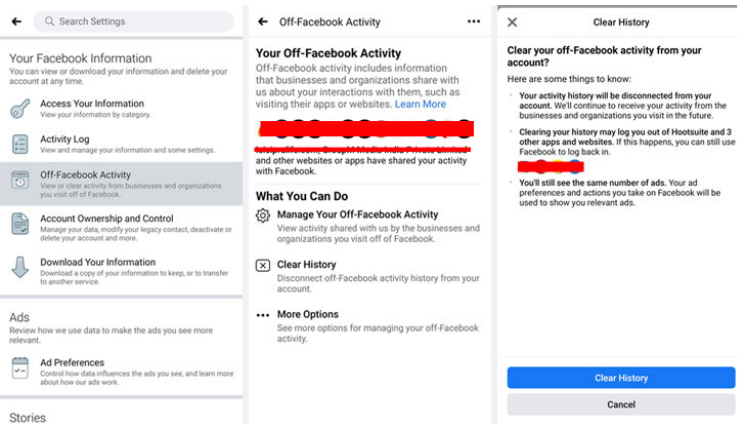

How to Clear Data Facebook Collects About You from Other Sites and Apps

FB is one of the world's biggest advertising platforms, and that's because it knows a lot about you, me, and everyone. It uses many tools to track people across the internet, whether they have an account with the social networking site or not.

FB announced last summer a privacy tool, called [Off-Facebook Activity](#), which gives users more control of their data collected by them. The tool offers users a clear summary of what information FB holds on you based on other apps you used or websites you've visited and also lets you delete it from your account if you want to. CMS rolls out Medicaid block grant option for states

To adopt the new financing approach, states will be required to submit a Section 1115 waiver outlining how the state would modify its Medicaid program using a capped-funding approach. State decisions to adopt the block grant or per capita cap option would impact counties.

Counties oppose using block grants and per capita caps in Medicaid as these approaches could force counties to make cuts to program eligibility, benefits and provider payment rates. Counties could also face increased costs for uncompensated care costs for individuals who become uninsured as a result of the reduced federal share in Medicaid payments.
