- Peer Learning Session (30 minutes)
 Peer learning sessions that meet the needs of practitioners and consider these best practices https://fireadaptednetworkorg/resource/fac-net-facilitators-quide-hosting-learning-exchange/.
- Group/General Presentation (45 minutes 1 hour)
 Group/general presentations that provide broader topics such as research findings and large-scale issues.
- ❖ Workshop (1 1/2 hours 2 hours)
 Workshops that require a longer or more interactive session.

- Speaker biography (short)
